Rules of the Road

- Pass port-to-port.
 - Power gives way to sail.
 - Read road signs as if you are entering the harbour (i.e. they'll be on the 'wrong' side if you're sailing towards The Heads).
 - Stay off private jetties and slipways.
 - You may only launch at public slipways (Crabs Creek, The Point, KADA, Leisure Isle Boat Club, Brenton-on-lake). Slipway fees may apply.
- Remember to check the weather forecast.
And are you sure your boat is seaworthy?



- Channel Marker (Mid channel buoy)
- Channel Marker Port (left) bank
- Channel Marker Starboard (right) bank
- Navigation Beacons (Leading Lights)
- Beacon (Obstruction)
- Beacon (Invertebrate Reserve)
- Lagoon Mouth (Only surveyed, twin-engined craft piloted by licensed skippers may cross this line)
- Danger Buoy (Do not cross this line)
- Private Slip or Public Slipway
- Private Jetty
- Oyster Beds (Keep out)
